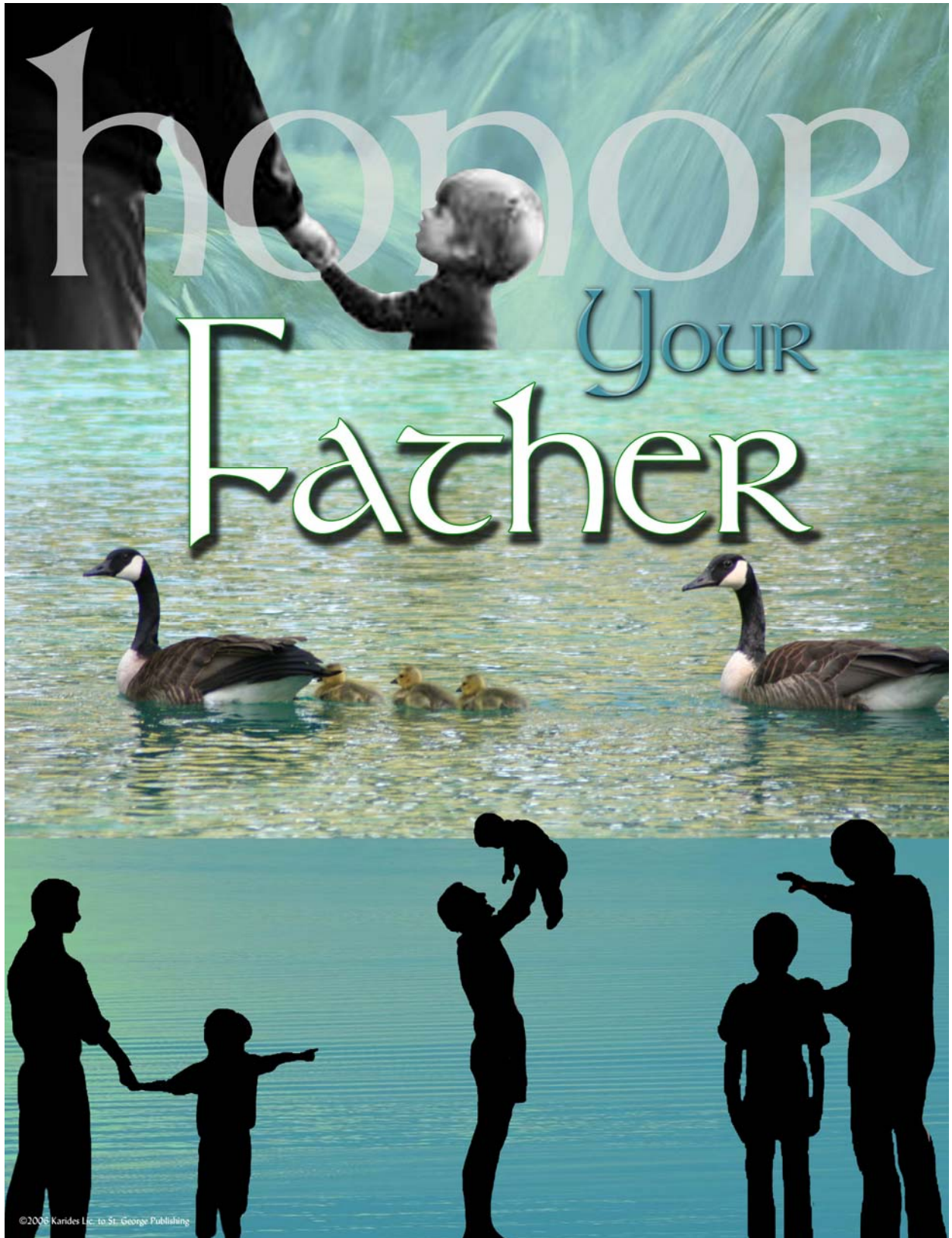




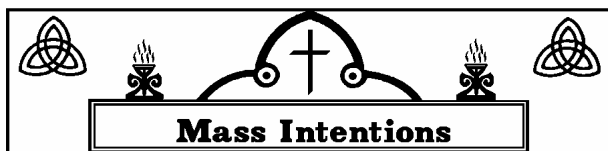

MASS INTENTIONS

You may notice that when we print the Mass Intentions each week that there are occasional blanks.

We encourage you to contact the office and talk with Alma or Diane to schedule Masses (but not on Mondays please!) on behalf of a loved one. You can usually get a Mass said right around your requested time frame. Weekend Masses are usually more full than week days (except 5pm Sunday is often available).

The policy is that there can be no more than one Mass per month for anyone, and that there can be no more than two weekend Mass intentions for someone in a six month period of time.

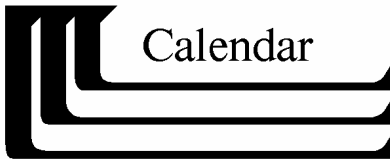

SOCIAL JUSTICE INFORMATION

In light of the recent debate over Arizona's new immigration law, Our Sunday Visitor asked Bishop John C Wester of Salt Lake City, chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on Migration to answer some of their readers' toughest questions about the Church's position on immigration. Fr Ken asked that these questions be put in the bulletin between the May 30 and June 27 issues.

QUESTION #4

Why should not the priority be on the development in the countries the immigrants come from so they do not want to come here in the first place?

ANSWER:

In fact, the U.S. bishops have stated that Congress should look at the "push factors", such as the lack of living-wage employment, that compel immigrants to leave their home countries and risk their lives to come to the United States in search of jobs.

As a global institution, the Catholic Church believes that the most humane and effective long-term solution to irregular immigration is economic development in poorer countries, so that people can stay in their home countries and support their families in dignity. In the context of the current immigration debate, this is the Church's answer to a border wall, which will not prevent irregular migration over the long term. The Church believes that migration ultimately be driven by choice, not necessity.

Next week's question: *What kind of immigration reform do the bishops want exactly? Amnesty? Open borders?*

SPRING AND SUMMER BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS PROJECTS

After careful analysis, in consultation with the buildings and grounds people, and with the approval of both the parish and finance councils, we have begun several projects for our buildings. They are as follows:

- ♣ New doors for the Adams Street entrances. Total project cost: approximately \$13,500 **SHOP DRAWINGS COMPLETE** and doors are ordered. Analysis is now being done on the right way to build up the door frames prior to installing the new doors.
- ♣ Steeple lighting from the bank. Cost: \$1,100. **FINISHED!**
- ♣ Spotlights on our Adams Street entrance statues. Total project cost: approximately \$1,000 **FINISHED!**
- ♣ One additional hallway light. Project cost: approximately \$350 **FINISHED**
- ♣ Overflow projection needs. Several times each year (about 8 for sure), we need to project liturgies or events from the church to the parish hall. We need to change some wiring, add cameras, and update the projection system in the parish hall. Approximate cost: \$15,000. One private donation has already come in earmarked towards this project. The proper cameras and wiring are now identified.
- ♣ Parish hall window treatments. Total cost: \$2,400 **WINDOW TREATMENTS ORDERED**
- ♣ Bulletin boards. We want to replace them with enclosed boards, similar to those where we mount photos outside the gathering space. Approximate cost: \$900.
- ♣ Sacred Heart and St. Therese statues are in need of repair. Approximate cost: \$1,500. Restricted donation for statues received. They are presently “in the shop” and will be back in a few weeks.

Total approximate cost of all of these repairs \$35,500.

LIFE LINE SCREENINGS

FRIDAY, JULY 30: RIGHT HERE AT ST. WILLEBRORD

Stroke/Carotid Artery Screening: ultrasound scan of the carotid arteries that screens for buildup of fatty plaque—the leading cause of strokes.

Atrial Fibrillation Screening: screens for the most common irregular heart beat, which increases the risk of stroke 5-fold.

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Screening: ultrasound scan that screens for the existence of an aneurysm (enlargement) in the abdominal aorta that could lead to a ruptured aortic artery.

Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening: screens for peripheral arterial disease in the lower extremities. An abnormal result may indicate a risk for peripheral arterial disease and an increased risk of coronary artery disease.

Osteoporosis Screening: an ultrasound measurement of the heel bone to determine abnormal bone mass density.

^a You can sign up for one or more of these tests. Appointments are required. Call **1-877-792-8480**. The number of appointments they can take is limited, and this event will be advertised regionally very soon—so call now to be sure you can take advantage of this opportunity.

AN INVITATION FOR YOU. IT IS AN HONOR TO PROCLAIM THE WORD OF GOD, AND AN HONOR TO DISTRIBUTE THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST.

We have a Special Invitation for you. Watch the Liturgical Ministers at Mass. Talk with them. Ask yourself: "Could I do that? Could I serve God's people at Mass?" - WE NEED YOU !! What is a Liturgical Minister? A proclaimer of the Word, an altar minister, a commentator (an announcer) and Communion distributors. We help Fr. Ken and the other priests at the altar. We serve God's people, YOU.

We belong to teams – usually 7- 10 people per service. Most of us serve every other week-end in whatever role best suits us. The 5 PM Sunday (English) Mass especially needs new liturgical ministers - but all teams would welcome your service. Check the bulletin for the Mass time that would fit your life best.

To address four of the biggest concerns you might have – ...or "these might be reasons for NOT stepping forward"):

-- "I'll make mistakes": Don't worry about "making mistakes"! Training is provided – along with enrichment sessions you can choose to attend during the year.

-- "I'm too busy, can't be tied down." If a personal event or special reason turns up on our week-end to serve, we can take "time off". (Having enough people on the teams makes it easier to find alternates for the service.) Again, your team serves just twice a month.

-- "I don't want to talk in front of people." If you are not in the role of Minister of the Word or the commentator, you will not be "speaking in front of everyone". Distributing communion is one of the most important and meaningful roles - and requires one simple phrase "Body of Christ" or "Blood of Christ".

-- "I'm too nervous." After the first couple services, you'll be "a natural" just like all of us. There's plenty of support from the team members when someone new joins us.

With 16 English and Spanish Masses liturgical teams (and more who help with daily Masses as well), you can see that this is an important ministry and requires significant numbers of people. For various reasons (illness, death, moving away), a number of teams are short on members. We need God's people to step up and continue this ministry to God's people.
